

ORDINANCE 2022-19

An Ordinance to Modify Chapter 18, Article I, Division 2, Sec. 18-14 of the Municipal Code of the City of Irondale, Alabama

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF IRONDALE, ALABAMA, in regular meeting duly assembled, a quorum being present, and by authority thereof as follows:

Section 1. Modification of Chapter 18, Article I, Division 2, Sec. 18-14 – Rate Schedule.

- A. Chapter 18, Article I, Division 2, Sec. 18-14 of the *Municipal Code of the City of Irondale, Alabama* is hereby amended by deleting Sec. 18-14(a) in its entirety and replacing it with the following:

Chapter 18 – WATER

ARTICLE I. – IN GENERAL

DIVISION 2. – RATES; SERVICE CHARGE; RULES AND REGULATIONS

Sec. 18-14. – Rate Schedule

(a) Monthly usage rates.

First 1,500 gallons	\$16.10 minimum charge
All usage over 1,500 gallons	\$5.85 per thousand gallons
5/8 inch meters residential	First 1,500 gallons: \$16.10 minimum charge

All meters above 5/8 inch are considered commercial.

Commercial 1” and above: first 1,500 gallons, minimum charge.

All usage over 1,500 gallons: \$5.85 per 1,000 gallons

Meter Size	Minimum Charge
5/8 inch	\$16.10
1 inch	\$26.00
1 1/2 inch	\$39.00
2 inch	\$81.00
3 inch	\$126.00
4 inch	\$208.00
6 inch	\$282.00

Section 2. REPEAL. All ordinances, parts of ordinances, and resolutions in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 3. SEVERABILITY. That if any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance is, for any reason, held to be unconstitutional, such decision shall not affect the

vailidity of the remaining portions of this ordinance. The City of Irondale hereby declares that it would have passed this ordinance, and each section, subsection, clause or phrase thereof, irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, sentences, clauses and phrases be declared unconstitutional.

Section 4. LEGAL RIGHTS NOT IMPAIRED. That nothing in this ordinance or in the Code hereby adopted shall be construed to affect any suit or proceeding impending in any court, or any rights acquired, or liability incurred, or any cause or causes of action acquired or existing, under any act or ordinance hereby repealed as cited in Section 2 of this ordinance; nor shall any just or legal right or remedy of any character be lost, impaired or affect by this ordinance.

Section 5. ORDINANCE CUMULATIVE; COMPATIBILITY WITH OTHER REGULATIONS. This Ordinance shall not be construed to modify or to repeal any other ordinance, rule, regulation, or other provision of law except as set forth herein. The requirements of this Ordinance are in addition to and cumulative of the requirements of any other ordinance, rule, regulation, or other provision of law, and where any provision of this ordinance imposes restrictions different from those imposed by any other ordinance, rule, regulation, or other provision of law, whichever provision is more restrictive or imposes higher protective standards for human health or the environment shall control.

Section 6. PUBLICATION OF ORDINANCE. That the City Clerk of the City of Irondale is hereby ordered and directed to cause this ordinance to be published and that a copy of this ordinance be entered upon the minutes of the meeting of the City Council.

Section 7. EFFECTIVE DATE OF ORDINANCE. That this Ordinance and the rules, regulations, provisions, requirements, orders and matters established and adopted hereby shall be in full force and effect as of October 1, 2022, and shall continue in full force and effect from month to month and year to year from its effective date until repealed.
