

**Resolution 2023-R-54**

***A RESOLUTION AMENDING RESOLUTIONS 2022-R-229, 2023-R-14, AND 2023-R-26  
AUTHORIZING A MORATORIUM ON THE ISSUANCE OF SIGN PERMITS WITHIN  
IRONDALE CITY LIMITS***

**WHEREAS**, the City Council for the City of Irondale approved Resolution No. 2022-R-229 on December 6, 2022 implementing a sign moratorium for one hundred twenty (120) days in order to study and develop a permanent solution; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council for the City of Irondale amended Resolution No. 2022-R-229 through Resolution 2023-R-14 on February 7, 2023 to authorize new businesses in the City to (i) remove wall signs in existence that reflect the prior business on-site and (ii) to replace the sign message on freestanding signs already in existence (identifying a prior business) to reflect the new business as long as there is no structural modification of sign size, location or configuration; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council for the City of Irondale amended Resolutions 2022-R-229 and 2023-R-14 through Resolution 2023-R-26 on March 7, 2023 to (i) provide a way, with certain restrictions, for new businesses opening in the City to identify themselves to customers through new wall signage on their place of business and (ii) to extend the moratorium on the issuance of sign permits to May 5, 2023; and

**WHEREAS**, the current moratorium on the issuance of sign permits within Irondale city limits will expire on May 5, 2023; and

**WHEREAS**, the work to develop a new ordinance for the issuance of sign permits is nearing completion, but this work requires additional time to complete.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED** by the City Council of the City of Irondale reaffirms the moratorium declared on the issuance of sign permits under the City of Irondale's Municipal Code with the amendments set forth herein.

This moratorium is hereby extended until September 1, 2023, to allow the City to complete its analysis of revisions to the current sign ordinance and to finalize such revisions.

This moratorium is not intended to impact those signs currently existing within the City or sign permit applications that have already been filed with the City and are in process.
