A Resolution Authorizing the Allocation of Public Funds to Jefferson County, Alabama for the construction of a storm shelter in the City of Irondale.






RE: Irondale Storm Shelter

Dear Mr. Pennington:

Per our conversation today, the mayor wants the capacity of the Storm Shelter to be 200 people. The latest design is desirable, but the estimated costs are well over the funding provided by Jefferson County. The city will clear the trees and the stumps from the site.

The plan is to bid out the building as designed to see what the cost will be with a deductive alternate plan to reduce the parking lot size from 30 parking spaces to 16 parking lot spaces if the costs are too high.

Please have the mayor sign this letter if this is an acceptable plan to move forward with design and return.
